
On post family housing is mandatory, pursuant to USAG Stuttgart Command Policy Letter #63; however, this is based on limited availability. Approximately 50 percent of our service members live off post on the local economy. Housing, both on and off post, is typically smaller than those provided in CONUS, so it is pertinent to contact the housing office prior to planning your move.

While any move can be difficult, a move overseas can add several stressors not normally found in CONUS. Whether this is your first overseas move, or not, I encourage you to take full advantage of the knowledge and advice of your sponsor while you prepare. Your sponsor should be making initial contact with you within the next two weeks. If you have not heard from them within two weeks of the date of this letter, please contact the Joint Reception Center at DSN 314-430-8534 or commercial +49 (0)711-680-8534 for further assistance.

Upon your arrival, you will report to the Joint Reception Center, Headquarters Commandant's office located at Building 2308, Room 138, Patch Barracks, to begin in-processing to the command. It may take you approximately 10 duty days to complete the USAG newcomer's in-processing orientation. If your tour is accompanied, your spouse is welcome and encouraged to attend some or all of the in-processing classes; especially the host nation orientation and the German hospital tour.

I would like to, once more, welcome you to the EUCOM team. We look forward to your arrival and hope that your transition is a smooth one.

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## **Base Information**

USAG Stuttgart is a part of Installation Management Command (IMCOM), and manages five installations in the Stuttgart area: Panzer Kaserne, Patch Barracks, Kelley Barracks, Robinson Barracks and Stuttgart Army Airfield. Along with Base Operations Support services, we also provide services to community members on a daily basis. These services range from Family and Youth programs, to Fitness centers, to housing and vehicle services, to ensuring our community's well-being, safety and shelter. ## **EUCOM NEWCOMER CHECKLIST**

### ***Pre-Arrival:***

- 🍏 First and foremost visit <http://www.stuttgart.army.mil/Relocation.html>. This site has great information for all matters pertaining to USAG Stuttgart, including a “Plan My Move” calendar that allows you to organize your tasks and create a personalized information packet.
- 🍏 Active duty military should expect contact from directorate sponsor no later than 60-90 days from arrival. Civilians and reservists may request a sponsor via garrison’s website <http://www.stuttgart.army.mil/Relocation.html> if not contacted by a sponsor.
- 🍏 **Housing:** There are some floor plans for on base housing available on the relocation website <http://www.stuttgart.army.mil/Relocation.html>. If housing is available you will reside on base, this is mandatory. All unaccompanied members E-6 and below will reside in the barracks if rooms are available. If you plan to reside off base, find out what your housing allowance will be, start looking and setting expectations early and register on the Automated Housing Referral Network website (AHRN.com). There are other sources available through the Panzer Kaserne Housing Office but may require realtor commission, which is typically not reimbursable.
- 🍏 **Driving:** Ensure your state side driver’s license is valid for the period of your new assignment. You must also pass a driver’s test and obtain the US Forces Certificate of License to own, operate, and even pick up your vehicle that is shipped. The Relocation website has a link <http://www.stuttgart.army.mil/Relocation.html> to practice the driver’s test and information about driving while assigned to USAREUR. If you plan to drive outside of Germany it is recommended to obtain an international driver’s license prior to departing. You may do so by contacting your local AAA office or you may acquire one upon arrival at your new overseas assignment. Insurance in Europe is generally more expensive than stateside, be sure you discuss this with your carrier well in advance. Vehicles brought from the states, or purchased locally, must be registered with USAREUR. All shipped vehicles and used vehicles purchased in Germany must pass a safety inspection before they can be registered. Ship your POV early as possible, as it could take up to 60 days to arrive.
- 🍏 **Passports:** Dependents of service members are required to have a Status of Forces Agreement (SOFA) stamp in their tourist passport. It is highly recommended to acquire this or an Official no-fee Passport prior to your departure. If you plan to travel outside of Germany it is recommended that you as well as family members apply for a tourist passport immediately. Family members who are issued no-fee passports cannot be used in lieu of tourist passports.
- 🍏 **Kids:** See the link provided; it will assist with the registration information for incoming families and all of the forms needed for registration are located here, <http://stuttgart.armymwr.com/europe/stuttgart/programs/parent-central-services/>. Most of

the registration process can be completed prior to the family's arrival. Recommend completing the medical paperwork stateside, due to the limited services provided here. Upon arrival, the Service member will need to visit the Parent Central Services (Patch Barracks Bldg. 2347) to sign consent forms and finalize their children's registration. At this time, active duty Army personnel will be issued vouchers for in-processing childcare, FREE Child Care for 16 hours per child (due to budget constraints this service may only be available to Active Army personnel). Please keep in mind that children with special needs that have medical restrictions or have a special diet will need to have the DA Form 7718 completed prior to utilizing the FREE Child Care. For additional information refer to Tab K, and if you have additional questions or concerns you may contact the Patch CDC at DSN: 430-5123 or by commercial at 0711-680-5123.

- 🍏 **Pets:** It is imperative to review the relocation website <http://www.stuttgart.army.mil/Relocation.html> under Pets for specific details to include restrictions, responsibilities and the paperwork required prior to travel. There are pet transport companies available (PetSafe via United) that will handle the details, however be prepared to pay for it as it can be expensive. For additional information regarding pet travel refer to Tab L.
- 🍏 **What to pack VS what to store:** This is a big decision, make it carefully. A good rule to go by is “less is best” that means DO NOT ship large appliances like washers and dryers etc. On base storage is limited to your quarters and there are limited off base storage facilities. Off base, 110V appliances require transformers and/or converters. For storage needs (most houses don’t have closets), you’ll be authorized one wardrobe/shrunk per person plus one for the household.
- 🍏 **Unaccompanied Baggage:** Some of the items you will need quickly: linens, towels, air mattress, bikes, toys, pet supplies, specific medications/supplements, toiletries, etc.
- 🍏 **ACS Lending Closet:** Dishes, cookware, microwaves, car seats, pack and plays, strollers, high chairs, and other initial “house set up” items are available for temporary usage that must be returned if needed before your unaccompanied baggage arrives. To see a more detailed list of available items refer to Tab J.
- 🍏 **Flights:** Be sure to go to your local SATO travel office to book your flight, do so as early as possible so that your sponsor can secure your lodging reservation and anticipate your date of arrival. It’s also important to consider the weather if you’re shipping pets. If it’s too hot they will not be able to fly.
- 🍏 **What to expect from your sponsor in the pre-arrival phase:** Communication – early and often!
  - Assistance or lead on securing temporary lodging reservations
  - Setting up a Community Mail Room post office box for you (they’ll need your orders)
  - Airport pickup

- Initial escort for inprocessing duties
- 🍏 **Misc:** Valid Security Clearance? Vehicle and Renters Insurance? Cancel all stateside cell phones/contracts, etc? Consider renting a car upon arrival to facilitate house hunting.

### ***Arrival:***

- 🍏 When are you scheduled to arrive? If you are on an overnight flight, your room will likely not be ready until the afternoon around 1400 hrs. If you are arriving on an overnight flight, consider reserving the room for the previous night (not reimbursable but worth it if you and your family need a bed) Your sponsor will pick you up from the airport so make sure they know in advance what your “load plan” looks like (ie you plus two bags vs you plus 3 kids plus 2 dogs)
- 🍏 Day 1: 1) Check into EUCCOM Joint Reception Office, located on Patch Barracks Bldg 2308/Rm 138 to pick up USEUCCOM inprocessing check list; 2) Installation Access Control (IACS); 3) Civilians to CPAC; 4) Marines to Marine Corps Forces (MARFOREUR/AF). Your sponsor should pick you up and take you where you need to be for the first couple of days.
- 🍏 Pick up local maps, bus schedule and an installation phone guide at the desk where you pick up your garrison inprocessing checklist.
- 🍏 Purchase a cell phone and have your sponsor help load important numbers: MPs, their home and cell, office home and cell, hotel number, etc.
- 🍏 Recommend the Thrift Store on Patch Barracks, Stuttgart Yard Sales and Stuttgart Bookoo for used appliances, transformers, furnishings, etc.

### ***Post-Arrival:***

- 🍏 Check in with your sponsor daily.
- 🍏 Complete all three checklists and turn them in within 30 days: Garrison, EUCCOM, and Directorate.

SUBJECT: USAG Stuttgart Command Policy Letter # 63 – Mandatory Housing Assignment

1. REFERENCES:

- a. Memorandum, HQ USAREUR and IMCOM-Europe, dated 14 June 2011, Subject: Housing Assignment Policy for the Army in Europe.
- b. AR 420-1, Army Facilities Management, 12 February 2008, Rapid Action Revision (RAR), 24 August 2012, Section 3-16 Para k. (7).
- c. AE 37-4, Providing Temporary Lodging Allowance in USEUCOM, 07 May 2010.

2. PURPOSE: To establish USAG Stuttgart Mandatory Housing Assignment Policy.

3. APPLICABILITY: All eligible Military Personnel assigned within USAG Stuttgart.

4. POLICY: In order to maximize the use of adequate on post quarters, eligible accompanied Service Members will be assigned involuntarily to available adequate Army Family Housing (AFH) units. Only when adequate AFH cannot be provided within a maximum of 60 days of arrival will Service Members be issued a Certificate of Non-Availability (CNA) authorizing them to seek off post Private Rental Housing (PRH).

5. In the event that a Service Member declines assignment to adequate AFH and elects to reside in PRH, Overseas Housing Allowance (OHA) and Move-in Housing Allowance (MIHA) are not authorized. All costs associated with residing on the economy will be at the Service Member's expense.


6. When PRH is authorized, an aggressive housing search must be performed in order to retain Temporary Lodging Allowance (TLA) eligibility. For USAG Stuttgart, an aggressive Housing Search is defined as a minimum of 3 to 4 property viewings per week. Failure to perform an aggressive housing search, as determined by the Housing Office, may result in immediate discontinuance of TLA entitlements. NOTE: Verification procedures include, but are not limited to, completion of Viewing Comment Cards signed by the property owner/manager or a similar written document representing properties viewed. Complete procedures will be explained in detail by your servicing Housing Counselor during your in-processing brief.

7. Service Members (SM) must secure a temporary month to month rental if locating permanent off post quarters would likely take the SM beyond 60 days of TLA. For your convenience, a list of affordable month to month rental properties is located in the Housing Office. A month to month rental lease will initiate your OHA entitlement and take you off of TLA status. USAG Stuttgart does not provide temporary housing accommodations.

8. TLA is not authorized beyond 60 days unless extenuating circumstances/sufficient justification exists that is out of the control of the SM. In the event a SM believes that special conditions exist, an Exception to Policy (ETP) to extend TLA entitlement must be staffed through the SM's commander and submitted to the Housing Office at least 10 calendar days prior to the 60<sup>th</sup> day of TLA. ETP's must contain proper justification and include verifiable details of his/her unique situation. NOTE: It is the SM's sole responsibility to ensure ETP requests are submitted on time to the Housing Office. ETP's submitted beyond the 50<sup>th</sup> day of TLA may not be considered.

9. This memorandum is valid until superseded.

MEMORANDUM FOR All Service Members, Civilian Employees and Family Members Working or Residing in USAG Stuttgart.

SUBJECT: USAG Stuttgart Command Policy Letter #51, Off-Post Uniform Wear

1. REFERENCES:

- a. HEADQUARTERS USEUCOM OPORD 11-05, Antiterrorism, 31 May 2011

2. PURPOSE: To establish the USAG Stuttgart off-post uniform wear policy.

3. APPLICABILITY: This policy applies to all Department of Defense personnel assigned, attached, or in transit in the USAG Stuttgart area of responsibility, except those who fall under chief of mission responsibility for force protection. This policy does not apply during military missions (e.g. official ceremonies, band appearances, training events, etc.) or operations where the wearing of uniforms is consistent with the mission and mode of travel. Commanders may establish and enforce more stringent requirements on personnel within their organization as appropriate to the threat and circumstances, as they deem necessary.

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SUBJECT: USAG Stuttgart Command Policy Letter #51, Off Post Uniform Wear

#### 4. GUIDELINES:

a. Personnel traveling within or transiting the USAG Stuttgart AOR via commercial means (e.g., aircraft, trains, buses, taxis, etc.) will wear civilian clothing. When possible, personnel will not carry items such as luggage and backpacks that readily convey an affiliation with DoD. This includes camouflage pattern backpacks, military style backpacks, or duffel bags. Personnel traveling via military / military contract transportation will wear the uniform prescribed in applicable deployment or travel orders.

b. Uniforms will not be worn to off post restaurants/food vendors, shopping areas, theaters, or other high population venues.

c. Exceptions to 4.a. and 4.b. above can be made for formal dinners, balls, and receptions when proper security measures have been taken. Off-installation gatherings in uniform of up to 299 personnel require a special event packet signed by the Garrison Commander submitted 30 days in advance IAW table J-1, AER 525-13 Antiterrorism. Off-installation events with 300 or more DoD personnel, regardless of uniform, require General/Flag officer approval and must be submitted to the Garrison Commander for approval 45 days in advance.

d. Service Members, when not attending off installation events for which uniforms are otherwise authorized per paragraph 4.c., are not authorized to wait in uniform in off installation establishments such as hotel lobbies and curbsides while awaiting transportation.

e. Any reference to uniforms in this memorandum includes physical fitness and JROTC uniforms.

f. Physical Training (PT) uniforms are not authorized to be worn off post. PT tests that must be conducted in a PT uniform will be conducted on post. Unit PT formation runs will not occur off post, regardless of uniform.

g. Members of the Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps (JROTC) will comply with all uniform standards prescribed in this policy letter as cadets may be mistaken for service personnel.

h. Uniforms will not be worn when traveling by motorcycle/scooter, bicycle or foot. (FPCON). Personnel traveling on motorcycle/scooter, bicycle, or foot will not carry backpacks that readily convey DOD affiliation.

i. DOD personnel in off installation hotels may wear uniforms when departing or arriving in an enclosed private, government, or rental vehicle. Uniform wear in public areas of hotels, such as breakfast or dining room, bar, or fitness room, is prohibited.

j. Uniforms when not worn will be carried in an inconspicuous manner, out of plain sight. Specifically, service members should not utilize public transportation, walk or bike off installation while carrying their uniform in a transparent bag or uncovered on a hanger.

k. DoD conferences, and special events off post in the USAG Stuttgart AOR should be held in civilian clothes.

l. Service Members picking up personnel from the airport will wear civilian clothes.

m. Service Members are not authorized to wear miscellaneous uniform items such as cold weather or wet weather jackets and pants, regardless of whether the uniform items are part of current service uniforms (e.g., BDU, DCU), while participating in MWR, USO, or unit sponsored outdoor activities (skiing, snowboarding, hiking).

n. Uniforms are authorized on shuttle buses at all FPCONs.

o. Uniform wear while escorting children to/from or waiting at off-installation DODDS bus stops is prohibited.

p. Uniform wear is authorized when representing the US military at an official Host Nation (HN) function.

q. Uniform wear while conducting military operations, training events and exercises is authorized. Commanders should minimize wear off US or HN military installations when possible.

5. During FPCON NORMAL, ALPHA, and BRAVO, wearing of military uniforms off U.S. or HN military installations and /or outside of other controlled environments is authorized only for:

a. Direct vehicle travel among domicile and US or HN military installations only while traveling via an enclosed private, government, or rental vehicle. Uniform wear is prohibited while traveling by motorcycle/scooter, bicycle, or foot. Uniforms are not permitted on any form of public transportation, including taxis.

b. Brief essential stops at public locations, such as gas stations or off-installation child care facilities during commutes. Dwell time should not exceed 10 minutes and stops should not be routine or predictable in nature. Stops at fast food restaurants, shopping areas, or other public venues are not authorized.

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SUBJECT: USAG Stuttgart Command Policy Letter #51, Off Post Uniform Wear

c. Foot marches off post with military equipment. Uniform wear while conducting military operations, training events and exercises is authorized. Commanders should minimize wear off US or HN military installations when possible.

6. During FPCON CHARLIE, wearing of military uniforms off U.S. or HN military installations and /or outside of other controlled environments is authorized only while traveling between home and work, and to official functions.

a. Military uniforms are not authorized to be worn for brief essential stops such as off installation childcare facilities or service stations or non-essential/convenience-related stops at fast food establishments, convenience stores, markets, or other related locations.

b. No PT off post regardless of uniform.

c. Foot marches off post with military equipment is not authorized.

7. During FPCON DELTA, wearing of military uniforms off U.S. or HN military installations and /or outside of other controlled environments is not authorized except when traveling to and from command directed official functions.

8. The USAG Stuttgart Threat Working Group will conduct periodic reviews of this policy ensuring that it remains adjusted to local conditions, threats, and future guidance.

## DISCLAIMER

This guide is made up of notes and suggestions for making life overseas a little easier and more enjoyable. Some things we learned the hard way, and we hope what we’ve learned will be helpful to you. However, we are not experts, and all information is based on our own personal experiences.

# All Things Automotive

## DRIVING, PARKING & FUELING

1. When using the fuel ration card at off-post Esso Stations, remember that the card tracks the number of liters allotted to that vehicle only; the money on the card applies to all of the vehicles your family has. If you accidentally go over the dollar amount you have in the card's account, AAFES will still allow the transaction to go through; you will just have to pay back the amount over and put more funds in before you use the card again. However, if you exceed the number of liters you have left for the month on that vehicle, the transaction will not go through and you will have to pay for the entire amount of the transaction in Euros, and at the German rate, which right now is about \$9.00 per gallon.
2. The blue parking disc that you receive for showing how long you have been parked in a parking space is not only for use in town. You are required to use it for many on-base parking areas as well, to include the Post Office and Commissary on Patch. When in doubt, put it out!



Bottom line: always know the dollars and liters left on your card.



3. When parking in a pay German parking lot or garage, you must take your ticket to a "Kasse" (Pay Here) machine (usually somewhere in the lot or at the entrance to the garage) and pay for parking *before* you try to drive out of the lot. If a store or restaurant validates parking (and this may not be full validation, only partial), you must get your ticket stamped, and *still* bring it to the Kasse to be stamped before you go to your car. The gate will not accept your ticket and open unless you have already paid or had the validation stamp scanned in the machine.
4. On-street parking usually requires payment as well. Look for the "Parkscheinlosen", a nearby metal box mounted on a pole where you can purchase your ticket. You must buy a ticket (good only for a certain amount of time; stated on both the machine and ticket) and place it in the window of your vehicle *before* you go to dine, shop, etc. If you don't have one, or if it expires, you can be ticketed.
5. Stay out of the left lane on the Autobahn unless you are passing; in Germany, the left lane really is for passing only.
6. Occasional frustration is a part of the driving experience; however, do not express your anger by "flipping the bird", following too closely or flashing your high beams at someone – you can be ticketed for doing so, and the fines are very high.
7. Slow down if you see the cars ahead of you slowing; it usually means a traffic camera, an accident or a stau.



8. Since we mentioned it, “stau” is one of the first German words you should learn. It means traffic jam, and is unlike anything you are likely to see in the States outside of major metropolitan areas. Tune in to your radio for regular traffic reports (both AFN and local radio stations have them) and avoid stau if possible. Autobahn A8 directions Karlsruhe and Munich, A81 direction Singen, and the B14 to Stuttgart Zentrum are often heavily congested during morning and evening rush hours.



9. Your child will likely need a booster or car seat here until 12 years of age. If your child is under 12 and shorter than 150 centimeters (about 59 inches), he or she must be in a car seat or booster seat. If they are under 12 and 150 centimeters or taller, they must use a seat belt; no booster seats are allowed. If they are 12 or older, regardless of height, they must use a seat belt (no boosters).

10. Owning a GPS is invaluable in Europe. You can buy one in the States before you PCS (it may be less expensive) and purchase the European map disks, if they are not included. Depending on the brand you choose, you may also be able to download maps online.

11. If you purchase a used car here, especially from another military family who is PCS'ing, remember that many of these cars have German “specs” (specifications). If you are not sure, ask. Good indicators: speedometer in kilometers, gas gauge in liters. These cars cannot be taken back to the US without a conversion (usually expensive). If the car has US “specs”, you can take it back to the States.

12. Talking on your cell phone while driving will get you a 40 Euro fine. You can be fined even if the car is stopped, but the engine is running. If you need to take or make a call, pull off the road and turn off your engine.



13. You can be fined for running out of gas on the Autobahn.
14. Traffic cameras are very common in Germany, and not all of them are stationary. Some are mobile, and are moved place-to-place. You may or may not see the flash if you are photographed speeding, but you will get the ticket in the mail. Your fine must be paid in Euros, by wire transfer, which can be done at any bank, on or off-post.
15. Always carry both your stateside and your USAREUR licenses with you, and have your green international insurance card (provided by your insurance company) in your car at all times.
16. It is a very good idea to have ADAC, which is the German equivalent of AAA. ADAC annual membership covers the driver, not the car; if you are

married, it is best to have ADAC Plus (sort of like ADAC on steroids), which covers both you and your spouse. ADAC offers towing and breakdown/road service in almost any EU country. You must keep your local address, not your CMR, in your car. It must be printed on an official document. If you live on-post you can ask ADAC to mail you your membership cards to your on-post German address. If you live on the economy, you can use any piece of mail that has your German address on it. You will need your official German address if you ever need to obtain a rental car through ADAC. They have an office in Breuningerland in Sindelfingen, and can also be found on the web at [www.adac.de](http://www.adac.de).

17. Ship your car EARLY and rent a vehicle in the States so that your vehicle is already here when you arrive. Renting a car is expensive (and you'll get a tin can) in Germany, plus the military does not reimburse you for this added expense.



# Transportation

## TRAINS & PLANES

1. Do not try to use public transportation without a ticket. The ticket checkers are hard to spot, and it will cost you an immediate 40 Euros if you are caught. Remember that all tickets need to be punched before you ride, both going and returning; look for the orange boxes near the escalators or on the platform.
2. It is legal to bring your dog or cat on German trains, but make sure that your pet doesn't get nervous in crowds; the trains are generally very full during morning and evening rush hours.
3. When purchasing a ticket for the U-Bahn or S-Bahn from the automatic ticket machines, look for the little country flags on the screen before you start and press the button next to the British flag; the screens will display in English.
4. Long-term parking at the Stuttgart airport can be extremely pricey. If you can, arrange a ride with friends, or take a taxi. Either is going to be a less expensive option.
5. The website for the German train system (within and outside of Germany) is [www.dbahn.de](http://www.dbahn.de); the one for the Stuttgart regional train and bus is [www.vvs.de](http://www.vvs.de). Both have English pages, and you can book tickets online or check schedules.



# Health Care



If you have a family emergency and need to go to a local German hospital, *always* remember to call the MP Desk first. They will have a translator call the hospital for you, and can also sign an ambulance in to base if that is needed. If you are out and about and have to go to a German hospital, call them as soon as possible. They will notify the translator and also TRICARE and the Patient Liaison.

# Shopping

1. If you go to a German grocery store or other store that uses shopping carts, you must put a 1 Euro coin in the handle to unlock the cart for use. You get the coin back when you return the cart and lock it in with the rest.
2. Always carry Euros! Germany is essentially a cash economy. Many German grocery stores, smaller stores, bars and restaurants do not take credit cards. You must pay in Euros or with a German EC (Electronic Cash) card, which you receive only if you open an account with a German bank.
3. You may want to bring extra pillows and linens for all your beds, especially if you have a preference as to brand, thread count, etc. The selection at most PX's is necessarily limited, and you may or may not be able to order what you want online.



4. For Navy, Marine and Air Force service members, you may want to visit your Uniform Shop stateside before coming to Germany. AAFES Clothing Sales has a very limited selection of items for services other than Army. The store also does not do special orders; you must do them yourself, by phone or online, and should factor in shipping time. You may also want to stock up if a Uniform Shop/Clothing Sales store for your branch of service is available somewhere you are TDY/TAD.
5. Keep a VAT form in your glove box, even if you are not intending to go shopping that day. It will save you the 19% tax, and you never know when you might find that great piece you've been looking for!



6. Online shopping can be a great way to get things that are hard to find and/or expensive in Europe; however, check shipping and handling costs before you order. Also, make sure the company ships to APO addresses before filling your "cart"; most do, but there are some that don't.
7. "Never a Dull Moment" is a great guide to shopping and sightseeing in Germany. It is published by AWAG, and includes information on both Germany and other EU countries. Most entries will have street addresses, phone numbers and hours of operation, but since things do change, it is wise to call ahead and check, especially if the place you want to go is some distance away. "Never a Dull Moment" can be purchased at the USO on Panzer Kaserne.
8. Many German stores, including some groceries, do not give out shopping bags. You can purchase great cloth bags that fold up and store in a tiny pouch that clips to your purse; check local retailers. These bags are also very useful at flea markets.
9. Hornbach's (closest is in Boblingen) is very similar to Home Depot in the States. They also take VAT forms.
10. Shipping to and from the States can be expensive and time consuming. Christmas packages nearly always need to be mailed a week or two before Thanksgiving. The Post Office publishes a "Mail By" guide every year with the dates by which packages must be mailed to get to the US for Christmas. Also, consider shipping time when ordering gifts that you want to have here before the holidays. For gifts to Stateside family and friends, consider ordering online and shipping directly to the recipient; it could save you time and money.



**11.** Most towns have at least a weekly open-air market from spring until fall; some are year-round. Fresh vegetables, flowers, meat, cheese, wine and other local specialties are only some of what is available.

**12.** You may use any German bank Geldautomat (ATM/“green machine”) that takes your ATM card to get Euros. Exchange rates are not created equal; German banks typically offer an exchange rate that is slightly better than what you get at an American bank. If you are making a big purchase or if you pay your monthly bills in Euros, using the green machines may save you some money.

**13.** Christmas wouldn't be Christmas in Germany without the Weihnachtsmarkt or Christkindlmarkt (Christmas Markets). The ultimate website is [www.weihnachtsmarkt-deutschland.de](http://www.weihnachtsmarkt-deutschland.de).

**14.** Don't rely on the PX to have the sport shoes, socks, shin guards or other sports equipment your child needs. The REAL and Marktkauf stores have a selection of sports items, and Deichmann

has inexpensive soccer and other sports shoes. You also may want to consider ordering online if there is a specific brand or size you need. Whatever you decide to do, we suggest that you do not wait until the last minute to purchase your child's sports supplies.



**15.** Do not throw plastic or glass bottles away (sodas, juices, yogurts, beer bottles, etc) as you can turn many of them in to grocery stores (look for the automated machines) to get money back to spend in the store! Some people will even look through American dumpsters and collect returnable bottles (look for the word PFAND on the label). Pfand = cash for you! Most stores automated machines will kick out a voucher you can use when you make your purchases and take that amount off your purchases. Instant savings!

**16.** The PX has a limited supply and selection of Halloween costumes. Check on the Internet, and order as early as September. You can also pick up costumes in the local stores during Fasching season (German equivalent to Carnival or Mardi Gras).

**17.** If your child has his or her heart set on a particular themed birthday party, the supplies may not be available here. This is another thing you may want to order online, and early.

**18.** The REAL store has a frequent shopper's card that you can get at their information desk. You can collect points, and then redeem them on their website for free stuff. Check the desk when you visit; usually the person manning the desk does speak English.



**19.** Typical store hours in Germany are not like those in the States. For anyone used to the 24/7 American shopping ideal, this may come as a shock. Stores are usually open from 8:00 or 9:00 am, and close at 6:00 pm. Many smaller stores close for lunch, and on Saturday, many close between 2:00 and 4:00 pm. Stores are not open on Sunday.

**20.** There is a Flohmarkt, or flea market, every Saturday morning at the Karlsplatz in downtown Stuttgart. You can take the train to the Stuttgart Hauptbahnhof, then walk up through the pedestrian zone.



# Around the House

1. Many of the crew members who will be working your household goods delivery do not speak English (or German). There should be at least one crew member who does speak English, but he or she cannot be everywhere at once. To help facilitate getting everything to the right room, make a list of all the rooms in your new house, and assign a corresponding number to each. Tape a piece of paper with the right numbers on the door or doorframe of each room. As your goods come off of the truck, use a thick marker to mark each box with the correct room number (this is also a great job for your kids, if they are old enough). All your stuff will almost certainly make it to the right room!
2. If you use transformers, turn them off when not in use, as they pull a lot of power.
3. Whether living on-base or in town, you can plug your 110v lamps into 220v outlets without using a transformer. You will need only a plug adapter and European light bulbs (do not try to use American bulbs – they will blow up).
4. Doors and windows in homes on the economy generally do not have screens.
5. Most German houses do not have air conditioning (nor does on-post housing). While most of the year here is fairly temperate, it does get hot for some weeks in the summer. Window A/C units and fans from the States will use a lot of electricity with a transformer (off-post) and window A/C units of any type are not allowed in on-post housing. German standing fans are your best bet, and fairly inexpensive to acquire. Check the SCSC Thrift Shop on Patch, or even near the housing dumpsters (many people just put them out for the taking when they PCS).



6. US digital alarm clocks that are plug-in and not battery-operated will not keep correct time here, as the cycles are different. Advice: Purchase your alarm clock on the local economy.



7. Most German windows do not use curtain rods such as are common in the US (this is true for most on-post housing as well). Also, the walls in most German houses, as well as in on-post housing, are a cement type rather than dry wall construction. If you want to put up curtain rods, you may need permission from your landlord, as you will likely have to drill holes and use screw anchors to put them up.
8. You will have to decide for yourself what works best for your family when it comes to your 110V appliances and items such as grills and Christmas lights. Renovated on-post housing units do have 110 outlets in the kitchens and bathrooms, but off-post housing does not. Also, certain 110 appliances, when used with a transformer, either use more power than you may want to pay for, or will not work correctly (microwaves, for example) because of cycle differences. In some cases, buying German appliances can be more cost-effective in the long run.
9. Check the SCSC Thrift Shop on Patch Barracks before buying new German appliances or transformers; many people who are PCS'ing will consign or donate their German appliances before they leave, and you may find what you need at a very good price.
10. Just as with any military move, make sure you have an accurate list, photos or videos of your household goods, and receipts and appraisals for your valuables. Appraisals are important for full replacement value for damaged items, especially those you have had for some time; prices may have gone up significantly since you purchased them.
11. Stuttgart on-post housing has 110 voltage, so it is okay to bring your small American appliances and vacuum cleaners. Some, like the expensive stand mixers and other appliances that cycle (alarm clocks), may have trouble, but most work just fine.

- 11.** If you live out in town, you can purchase heating oil through the Customer Service Desk at the Panzer Main Exchange. AAFES has a contract with a local company; the price does change daily. If you choose to use the program, fill out a form at the Customer Service Desk, pay for your oil and schedule your delivery. A 5% AAFES surcharge applies. You can also simply check the price and use it as a basis for comparison off-post.
- 12.** Also for those of you who live on the economy: periodically get a signed “review” of your home from your landlord. When you PCS, a record of review will make it easier for you to get your deposit back, in the case of any dispute with your landlord as to the condition of your premises.
- 13.** Please note that in writing money amounts, Europeans use a comma where we use a period and a period where we use a comma. For example,  
\$35.00 is €35,00.  
\$35,000 is €35.000.  
You do not want to make this mistake when paying your bills.
- 14.** If you live on the economy, you may want to consider joining the German Renter’s Club. For an annual fee, you are entitled to their lawyers’ assistance with landlord/tenant disputes, and they can answer questions regarding your rights and responsibilities. Contact Mieterverein Sindelfingen, Untere Vorstadt 17, 71063 Sindelfingen. Tel: 0703-187-9544 or 0703-187-9661. Hours are Tuesday through Friday from 8:00am to Noon, and Thursday from 2-6pm.
- 15.** Renter’s vocabulary: your rent is the **Miete**; you are the **Mieter**, and your landlord is the **Vermieter**.  
**Kaltmiete** is your basic rent without additional charges.  
**Warmmiete** is the rent plus additional charges.  
**Nebenkosten**, or additional charges, could include a parking space, trash, insurance, etc. Be sure to check exactly what is included.

- 16.** If you live on the economy and request them, the Housing Office will provide you with an American fridge/freezer (larger than the German ones) and a washer and dryer. You will receive either a German or an American washer/dryer, depending on the water exchange and venting capabilities in your home. The German washer heats the water inside, rather than piping in hot water. The German dryer is a condenser machine that pulls the water out rather than heating your clothes dry.
- 17.** The water in this area is quite hard, and calcium deposits build up very quickly. You should use an additive in your dishwasher along with your dishwasher soap tabs. “Somat” is the popular brand, and can be found in the commissary as well as locally.
- 18.** Germany has fairly strict rules regarding what you can and can’t do in your house or apartment. For example, you may not wash cars in front of your house on Sundays or holidays (or at all, in some areas). You may not mow your lawn, weed-whack or engage in any other loud activities on Sundays or holidays, or during posted “quiet hours”. There also may be regulations as to whether and where you can install a satellite dish, and for storing items in and around your house such as bicycles, gas grills or mowers.
- 19.** Depending on the town where you live, there may be regulations for on-street parking for residents and guests. You may need to apply for a resident parking pass (Anwohnerausweis) at the Rathaus. You will need to show proof of residency, such as your rental agreement or a utility bill, and your auto registration. Be sure the proof of residency is in German and contains your name and residence address.



# Communication

## COMPUTERS, PHONES & MAIL

1. Calls to a cell phone from a landline can be extremely expensive. Also, if you have teens who like to call and text frequently, they may be better off with a cell phone that uses a limited Euro card. If you do choose to have a contract, for yourself only or for multiple family members, read the fine print carefully to make sure that the fees are what you consider reasonable.
2. Computers are available for anyone's use at the USO in Building 2915 on Panzer Kaserne and at the library on Patch Barracks. The USO will print the first five pages free; there is a cost of 10 cents per page thereafter. The library charges a small fee for printing as well. The USO also has a public use fax machine; the first five pages are again free, and there is a \$1.00 per page charge for additional pages.
3. When moving in to either on- or off-post housing, try to get the previous tenant's phone number to pass on to your phone company; your phone hook-up will go much faster.
4. Something to think about is getting a Vonage phone for use during your time here. It must be registered to a US address (think family member or friend). You are issued a US phone # which people in the States can dial as they would any stateside number. It costs approximately \$30.00 a month to call back and forth to the US, and for an additional \$6.00 a month you can call most of Europe. Please note that you do need high-speed Internet to use this service (it hooks up through your computer). Also note that if you have a lot of problems with your computer service where you live, Vonage may not work for you.



5. Unlike in the States, in Germany you are charged for each and every call you make, whether it is to your next-door neighbor, another state or another country. Your home phone is "Festnetz" in German.
6. If your computer is dual voltage, you can plug it into both 220v and 110v; the latter requires a plug adapter for 220v sockets. You will likely have to flip a switch (from 110v to 220v) on your computer before you turn it on. Do NOT forget to check this before powering up; otherwise, you can instantly fry your computer.
7. You can usually plug monitors directly into 220v outlets with only a plug adapter, but again, check for a switch first. Printers and speakers normally require a transformer. Check the output volts on your setup before buying a transformer, to make sure the one you choose can handle the amount of voltage you need.
8. On a snail mail note, if you have to mail a letter to a German address (a bill, or a ticket, for example), you do not have to go downtown to get a German stamp. As long as your return address is your CMR, with box number and APO, you can get a regular US first class stamp and mail it at an APO or in a US mailbox on any base.
9. Here is a brief rundown of how the German billing system works for those of you who have TKS, Telekom or another German telephone/internet provider: when you receive a bill, you have two weeks from the date on the bill to pay in full. Should you not pay within that time frame, they will issue a Past Due Notice; you will have six days to pay. If you have not paid after a total of 20 days from the date on the bill, the company will automatically cut off your service until the bill is paid; then they automatically turn it back on.



# Travel & Entertainment

1. The “Stuttgart Happenings” magazine, is a great way to keep up with classes and activities for all local MWR programs. The magazine is normally available at the Community Mail Room, the USO and at all MWR locations. You can also access it on the web at [www.mwrfirstchoice.com](http://www.mwrfirstchoice.com).
2. The USO is a great resource for travel information, maps and to purchase discounted tickets to local area attractions. They provide day and overnight escorted tours to local and distant destinations. All of their trips are listed in “the Kiosk” magazine that is available at the USO on Panzer Kaserne. You can also access it on the web at [www.uso.org/stuttgart](http://www.uso.org/stuttgart).
3. After 2:30 pm on weekdays, and anytime on weekends, the playground at Boblingen Elementary School on Panzer Kaserne is open for play. This is a great outdoor meeting place for Moms to take the kids.
4. Travel guides are a great way to plan a trip and learn about your destination in advance. The ones by Rick Steves are very good.
5. The community website is [www.stuttgart.army.mil](http://www.stuttgart.army.mil). It has monthly calendars, information on community events, and the online Community Post newsletter, which includes “Out and About in Baden-Wuerttemberg.” O & A has articles and information on local area events, to include fests, flea markets and volksmarches.
6. Another super website for military families has information on all bases in Europe, as well as info on facilities and programs at each, [www.gettingaround.net](http://www.gettingaround.net).
7. The Corso Theatre in Vaihingen shows original language movies, primarily American and English films. Check the website, [www.corso-kino.de](http://www.corso-kino.de) for general information and schedules.
8. Indoor and outdoor pools, mineral baths and spas are extremely popular in Germany. Many indoor facilities have saunas, steam rooms, lap, lounge,

and kiddie pools, and whirlpools. Please note that many of these are co-ed and clothing optional; be aware, and choose a facility that matches your comfort level.

9. Fests of all sorts are extremely popular in Germany. Oktoberfest in Munich, Sommerfest and Fruhlingsfest in Stuttgart, and the annual Fasching/Karneval (Mardi Gras) everywhere are just the beginning. Be aware that at most fests, beer and wine flow freely, and make sure you do not drive if drinking is on your agenda. Both the German Polizei and the MPs increase their DUI checkpoints during fest times.
10. Although most European countries use 220V/60Hz electricity, other countries may have slightly different plug configurations; always pack a multi-plug converter when you travel.
11. The RitterSport chocolate factory is right down the road in nearby Waldenbuch. The small museum is free, and there is a discount shop for overstock and mislabeled chocolate.
12. Want to spend a night (or several) in a real German castle? Schloss Weitenburg is about 45 minutes south of Stuttgart, overlooks the Neckar River and is run by a descendant of the family who has owned it for hundreds of years. He usually stops by during dinner and tells you which of his ancestors occupied the room you are staying in. They have an indoor pool, a small sauna, and there is a golf course a mile away. The website is in English: [www.schloss-weitenburg.de/schloss/index.htm](http://www.schloss-weitenburg.de/schloss/index.htm).
13. One of the most enjoyable family events in the Allgau region (east of the Bodensee, or Lake Constance) is the Cows Coming Home. It takes place in most of the towns and villages from around the 12th to the 24th of September, and celebrates bringing the cows down from their summer pastures and into the towns for the winter. They decorate the cows with flowers and bells, and make a great event of it. A great site is [www.oberstdorf.de/index.shtml](http://www.oberstdorf.de/index.shtml). Look under “Veisheid”. Parts of the site are in English.
14. Whenever you are out and about, make sure you have small change (coins under 1 Euro) for the restrooms. Some have attendants that you pay before you

enter; most Autobahn facilities require you to put in 50 cent Euro to pass through a turnstile into the restroom. The turnstile does, however, spit out a ticket good for 50 cent Euro towards anything you purchase (food, drink, etc.) at any Rest Stop.

**15.** Most Germans carry Travel Cancellation Insurance (Reiseruecktrittsversicherung) and Americans should too. For example, for one year's coverage to a max 3,000 euro per incident if you have to cancel for reasons of illness, job loss, etc, it is only just over 60 euro PER YEAR! You already have ADAC (like AAA) insurance for you and your vehicle (or you should), and you can purchase this Travel Cancellation Insurance through ADAC. The USO has an English translation of this document so you know exactly what is covered, the different levels of insurance and how you file a claim. Sign up at any ADAC store.

**16.** Best website for travel deals is [www.opodo.de](http://www.opodo.de). At the bottom of the page there is an icon, click on the British flag for English. You can use your American credit cards on this site. Another site is [\[lastminute.de\]\(http://lastminute.de\) \(or \[.com\]\(http://.com\)\). Many people also visit the last minute travel agencies at the airport or use local German travel agencies, including the travel agency connected to the main ticket office at the main train station in Stuttgart. Go there to pick up yellow rail/hotel flyer combos and book with HUGE savings to major European cities!](http://www.</a></p>
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**17.** The USO on Panzer Kaserne maintains a large supply of brochures and flyers for cities and venues around mostly Germany and elsewhere. Files are also maintained in the back where customers have brought back brochures and travel information from various locations. Check those out before you travel or book one of the USO tours and let someone else do all the work.

**18.** Be sure to pay and get your Blue Tourist Passport, as the process can take up to three or four months if you apply after you arrive. Many countries advise that you MUST have a Blue Tourist Passport and not just your official SOFA-stamped passport to cross their borders, particularly France. No, you can not travel on your military ID

# Your Pets

1. Dogs are generally welcomed everywhere in Germany, to include most hotels, stores, restaurants and bars (you cannot, however, take a dog into a German grocery store). It is always best to call in advance if you are not sure of the policy.
2. Pet passports are not difficult to obtain, and are a must if you intend to take your pet to European Union countries other than Germany. You can get the passports through any German veterinary office. The passport is not valid, however, for taking your pet back to the United States; guidelines for stateside travel can be obtained from the Vet Clinic on Panzer Kaserne.
3. If you live on the economy, be aware that the Germans have strict rules about the care of your animals. You cannot leave a pet tied outside, or alone inside for an extended period of time and it is frowned upon, if you do not walk your dog a few times a day. You cannot allow your dog to bark continually and disturb others. If you do any of these things and if your neighbors report you, your pet can be taken away from you by the German authorities.
4. The Panzer Vet Clinic does not offer emergency care. If you do have a pet emergency, the Dachswald-Klinik offers 24-hour service. They are located at Industriestrasse 3, 70565 Stuttgart-Vaihingen. The phone number is 0711-679-670 and the website is [www.dachswald-klinik.de](http://www.dachswald-klinik.de). The receptionist does not speak much English, but the veterinarians do.



## **PET TRAVEL**

### **MANAGING EXPECTATIONS WHEN BRINGING PETS TO AND FROM STUTTGART**

Below are some key points you should know before you plan your trip and if you follow this information, then bringing in your pet will be a much smoother transition.

Summer months are always difficult months for traveling with pets. The current embargo dates are usually enforced from May through September but that can always change depending on location and weather. Today you may get a flight out with your pet, but it could change due to weather and aircraft limitations. The pet owner is responsible for always following up with the airlines.

One must always follow ALL the rules from your stateside or military installation veterinarian for transporting your pet.

### **Direct Flights into Stuttgart**

There are two U.S.-flag carriers that fly directly into Stuttgart; United Airlines from Newark, New Jersey and Delta Airlines from Atlanta, Georgia.

Delta Airlines DOES NOT allow pets to fly in the cargo hold for flights into Stuttgart. Passengers in Economy section can bring small dogs or cats with them as long as the pet can fit under the seat. Delta has a limit of two pets total for the flight; thus it is imperative that you make your reservation as soon as possible. No other types of pets are allowed.

United Airlines DOES ALLOW pets to fly into Stuttgart for military personnel on PCS orders. See their website for further information: <http://www.united.com/web/en-US/content/travel/animals/default.aspx>.

Should you fly into Stuttgart with a pet; German Customs authorities will determine if a veterinarian is needed to examine your pet. The veterinarian is not on site and has to be called in. There will be charge of approximately 100 Euros for that service and payment must be made in cash. Expect a three to five hour wait for the veterinarian to arrive; even longer waits on weekends.

**\*\*Pets are not allowed to fly out of Stuttgart back to Newark-CONUS\*\***

### **Flying into other Airports**

If you are flying into another airport (e.g.: Frankfurt, Paris, Amsterdam) with a pet; these airports have veterinarians on duty. Again, there will be charge for the pet examination.

During summer months, some pets will not be allowed to be checked in as "luggage" if the climate is in excess of 85 degrees Fahrenheit (temperature restriction is at the

discretion of the airline). Every airline has different rules – make sure you check into that before departure.

### **Patriot Express and Space-A Flights into Ramstein AFB**

The Patriot Express is a DOD chartered air travel that transitions between Baltimore/Washington International Airport (BWI) and Ramstein Air Base. It is the preferred method, and your first option, of travel for US military and government civilians, inbound or outbound and is open to incoming military personnel, their family members and DOD civilians.

Benefits to using them are that you not only have a higher luggage weight allowance but you save on pet travel costs. There is a two pet per family limit.

Only PCS status passengers may request pet shipment. Pets cannot be shipped by personnel in a leave or TDY/TAD status. Sponsor(s)/ dependent(s) must accompany the pet to the final destination. Pets are defined as dogs and cats only. The maximum weight (kennel and pet) cannot exceed 150lbs. Waivers will not be issued for weight or type of pets.

### **Pet Embargo**

Most airlines have a pet embargo of 15 May to 15 September unless on PCS orders. Again, make sure you check with the appropriate airline for further details and restrictions.

### **Personally Procured Travel (PPT)**

Personally Procured Travel is an option if SATO can't accommodate your personal preferences. See the SATO Contracting Officer Representative at Patch Barracks prior to purchasing your own travel.

### **Costs Involved**

If you are using Patriot Express from BWI or Ramstein and they are not your final destinations, the remainder of your travel could result in additional out of pocket costs if your travel choice costs more than the contract carrier from origin to destination based on your orders. SATO or any other government travel representatives can assist you with that.

Just remember that even though our pets are a member of our family, they are not enrolled in DEERS and therefore; you must take special care of how to get your pet to and from.

## **Planning Ahead**

If you are unable to get your pet out of Stuttgart, SATO can book your flight out of Frankfurt or Munchen in order to facilitate pet travel for your personal move. Contact Ms. Bebber at SATO to get better clarification at DSN 430-2106/2107 or Civ: 0711-680-2106/2107. You may also want to consider other pet shipping companies such as Air Animal, Pet Air Carrier, UShip, International Pet Movers any many other choices.

Always keep in mind that this information is always subject to change. Constantly check with the airlines, your sponsor and veterinarian prior to arranging your travel to or from Stuttgart. Get all the necessary advice on preparing your pet for shipment.

Consider factors such as feeding, watering, sedative, etc. If at all possible, do not ship female pets that are in heat (estrus). This condition causes great distress to other pets and may result in injury.

Kennels must be a hard-shell, hard-sided International Air Transport Association (IATA) or U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) approved kennel which are available at most exchange/retail stores. Soft-sided or collapsible kennels will be not be accepted by most airlines. The kennel must be large enough for the animal to stand up, turn around, and lie down with normal posture and body movements. Several layers of newspaper, shredded paper, or absorbent material should be placed in the bottom of the container. Do not use straw, hay, grass, sawdust, sand, or soil. Normally, pets will be individually kenneled; However, two small animals of the same species and of comparable size up to 20 pounds may be shipped in the same kennel.

## **DOCUMENTATION NEEDED**

According to Public Health Command Region Europe:

### **PCSing to Germany from US**

First make sure that your pet or pets are chipped with a microchip that has a readable, working International Standardization Organization (ISO) code or ISO Compatible code embedded (you may carry your own reader).

Secondly you have to get a rabies vaccination which is required to have 21 days out prior to travel. But remember that the microchip implantation must occur prior to the rabies vaccination. This is important to note because any rabies vaccination that occurs prior to the microchip implantation, is not considered valid. If this is not the first time your pet has received a rabies vaccination and it has not expired, a pet booster shot is acceptable but also must be done 21 days prior to the travel, as in the original rabies.

And finally, you should have a EU Health Certificate (EU Form 998) not more than 10 days prior to arrival. Each pet has their own pet passport. A military veterinarian can sign the documentation but if one is not in your installation, then the form must be signed by a USDA (US Department of Agriculture) Veterinarian.

AND.....Always, always, make copies for yourself of all the documentations.

### **PCSing from Germany to US**

First, you must update that pet passport and get a new health certificate within 30 days prior to departure from Germany.

If your rabies vaccination is older than 12 months you will be required to get a new series of shots. Just remember, the shot must be administered 31 days prior to travel.

Should you have a puppy or kitten under 12 weeks of age, they will still be allowed to travel to the US, however, because of their age, once they arrive in country, they will be quarantined at an approved site until it reaches that mature age to get those shots. Of course, there will be a costs involved and that total can vary state to state.

\*\*Hawaii has different rules –check with your veterinarian.

Read paragraph #1 which applies to folks traveling with pets and #2 to those who are shipping their pet. #3 is for those with young animals. Also paragraph #5 lists the prohibited breeds to the country

These websites are nice because they are official US and German government websites and not some random person's thoughts on how to move with your pet.

JUST REMEMBER – anything can change at any time. It is worth repeating to constantly stay in touch with the airlines, with your sponsor, with your veterinarian, for any updates. As soon as you know you have to travel and you have a pet, START THE PROCESS!!

- Pets accepted in the cargo compartment (55 pounds or larger) Domestic \$105/International \$200

**Air Canada** (888) 247-2262 (Partnership with United Airlines/Star Alliance) Fly's into Stuttgart, Germany

- Pets accepted in the cabin (22 pound including carrier) Domestic \$50/International \$100
- Pets accepted in the cargo compartment (70 pounds or larger) Domestic \$105/International \$270

**Air Europa** (800) 238-7672 (Partnership with Sky Team/Delta Airlines)

- Pets accepted in the cabin (22 pound including carrier) \$25 to \$100 depending on hours in flight
- Pets in the cargo compartment (70 pounds or larger) \$40 to \$160 depending on hours in flight

**AirTran Airways** (800) 247-8726 (Partnership with Southwest Airlines)

- Pets are accepted cabin. Need to call airline for cost, weight and destination restrictions
- Pets are not permitted to travel on international itineraries

**Alaska Airlines** (Partnership with Delta, American, various) (800) 252-7522

- Pets accepted in the cabin \$100 Weight not specified, must fit under sit comfortably
- Pets accepted in cargo compartment \$100 (100 pounds including kennel) American Airlines

**American Airlines** (Partnership with USAirways) (800) 433-7300

- Pets are not accepted cabin on international flights. Some domestic flights okay need to call airline for cost, weight and destination restrictions
- Pets are accepted in cargo compartment. Need to call airline for cost, weight and destination restrictions

**British Airways** 0421 5575 758

- Pets are not accepted in the aircraft cabin except for service animals.
- Pets must be booked to travel with British Airways World Cargo, and they will be carried in the aircraft hold.
- British Airways is part of the Pet Travel Scheme, Pet's Passport which allows cats and dogs from certain countries to enter the UK without the need to go through the usual 6 months quarantine.

**Continental Airlines** Partnership with United Airlines (800) 523-3273

- Continental does not accept pets as checked baggage, but does transport pets in cargo.
- The airline limits the number of pets who may be carried on in each cabin.
- Quarantine has been eliminated for pets flying to London on Continental Airlines.

**Delta Airlines** (Partnership with Delta, various Airlines) (800) 455-2720

- Pets are accepted in the cabin, and in the baggage and cargo compartments.

**Frontier Airlines** (Partnership with United Airlines) (800) 432-1359

- Pets are not accepted in the aircraft cabin, but are accepted in the baggage and cargo compartments.

**Go! Airlines Hawaii** (888) 435-9462 (potential connecting flight)

- Hawaii interisland airline operated by Mesa Airlines. Pets are accepted in the cabin, but are not accepted in the baggage compartment.

**Hawaiian Airlines** (Partnership with American, Virgin, various airlines) (800) 367-5320

- Pets are not accepted in the cabin on flights arriving into the State of Hawaii but are accepted on inter-island flights and flights leaving the State of Hawaii.

**Jet Blue:** JetPaws Pet Program (Partnership with Aer Lingus, British, various airlines) (800) 538-2583

- JetBlue gladly accepts small cats and dogs in the aircraft cabin on both domestic and international flights.
- To book your pet, call 1-800-JETBLUE (538-2583). Pets cannot be booked online.

**Northwest Airlines** (Partnership with Delta, various airlines) (800) 225-2525

- Pets are accepted in the passenger cabin on all flights within the U.S. (except to Hawaii) and between the U.S. and many international destinations.
- Pets are also accepted in the baggage and cargo compartments.

**Quantas Australia** (Partnership with American, British, various airlines) (800) 227-4500

- Pets are not accepted in the aircraft cabin, but may travel in the baggage and cargo compartments.

**Singapore Airlines** (Partnership with Delta, United, various airlines) (800) 742-3333

- Pets are not accepted in the aircraft cabin, but may travel in the cargo hold.

**SkyWest Airlines** (Partnership with Delta, United, US Airways, American, Alaska, (Need to contact direct airline flying on))

- Cabin Pets – One reserved kennel per flight.
- Check Baggage - Maximum kennel size accepted is limited to a reservation of one large kennel or two small or medium per flight.
- SkyWest does not accept extra-large or giant kennels. Reservations required.

**Southwest Airlines** (800) 435-9792

- Pets and other live animals are not accepted in the aircraft cabin or cargo compartment other than fully trained assistance animals.

**Swiss International Air Lines** (Partnership with various international airlines) (877) 359-7947

- Pets are accepted in the cabin and in the baggage compartment.

**Taca Airlines** (Partnership with Star Alliance) (800) 400-8222

- Up to 2 animals per flight—including both pets and seeing-eye dogs—may travel in the cabin; only cats and dogs are accepted on international flights.
- Some live animals are accepted as cargo on flights to/ from Central America and South America only.

**United Airlines** (Partnership with Star Alliance, various airlines) (800) 864-8331

- Pets are accepted in the cabin, and in the baggage and cargo compartments.
- Certain short-nosed dog breeds are not accepted as either checked baggage or cargo during the summer months.

**US Airways/America West** (Partnership with United, Star Alliance, various airlines) (800) 428-4322

- Pets and other animals are no longer accepted for travel as checked baggage or cargo except on non-stop US Airways Shuttle flights in the BOS/DCA/LGA markets only.

- The airline limits the number of pets who may be carried on in each cabin.

**Virgin Atlantic** (Partnership with Delta, many international airlines) (800) 862-8621

- Under the Government's Pet Travel Scheme (PETS) pets can now travel on Virgin Atlantic to and from Boston, Los Angeles, Miami, New York-JFK, New York-Newark, Orlando, San Francisco, Washington.
- Pets can also travel to Johannesburg

# PCSing TO GERMANY



- 🐾 Pets must be identifiable by way of an ISO microchip (or tattoo), which must be implanted prior to being vaccinated for rabies. Microchip numbers must be annotated on the rabies certificate.
- 🐾 Pets must be up to date on their rabies vaccination. If their rabies has expired, if it was not given prior to microchip implantation, or if it was a primary rabies vaccination, they must be revaccinated and the pet must wait 21 days before being eligible to enter the EU.
- 🐾 A Health Certificate, signed by a USDA certified veterinarian, must be obtained within 10 days of travel. You will want to obtain the certificate as close to your travel date as possible, in order to account for any possible delays during your journey, potentially extending your travel time beyond the 10-day period. We highly recommend obtaining a health certificate through a military veterinarian, if possible.
- 🐾 Requirements and restrictions vary between airlines. It is always best to consult directly with the airline with which you or your pet will be traveling, as soon as you book, to ensure that you are in compliance with their guidelines regarding pet travel (i.e. carrier info, required documents, space available, etc.).
- 🐾 To safeguard against unnecessary delays while traveling with your pet and to ensure proper transfer on or between flights (specifically for pets traveling in cargo), it is best to have your pet's records on hand and readily accessible. It is also recommended (and in some cases required) that a copy of your flight itinerary, orders, the pet's rabies certificate, and health certificate be sealed in a protective bag and affixed to your pet's kennel.
- 🐾 Upon arrival in country, be sure to register your pet with our facility within 2 weeks, if you wish to utilize our services and to locate an off-base veterinarian who will provide care, in the event of an emergency or for specialized treatment.
- 🐾 You may register your pet's microchip number, with your local information, into the local, free pet finder system, which will aid in helping you find your pet, should he/she get lost off post. Visit [Tasso.net](https://www.tasso.net) to register or for more information.
